Pick three people in fields related to your Interest.

- Think about your hobbies: do you enjoy taking photos? Look up the people working at a magazine like National Geographic, or your photography teacher at school or a sports photographer for your favorite team. Like surfing? Call someone who works for your favorite surf wear company.
- Look around your room: what are your favorite movies or posters, magazines, books, software...find out who's behind the stuff!
- Check out the "about us" sections on your favorite websites.

Now pick someone in a field you might be interested in.

- Never had a pet, but think you'd like to be a vet? Find someone who works at an animal hospital.
- Think you'd be interested in your own business, but not sure what it's like? Find the owner of a small business near you.

Now for the fun part. This time, **pick someone that is a wild card** to interview:

- These are impressive inspiring people you look up to, yet never thought you'd meet until now! Don't be intimidated by someone's fame or success– that's how you'll get the courage to talk to someone great. It's flattering for them that you look up to them so don't be shy.
- Think of your idols, your heroes who do you find inspiring? Flip through newspapers or magazines for ideas. Maybe even reach out on social media!

Don't be afraid to ask your family or friends for help.

Stay open to Interview opportunities.
